

# GOLDRUSH

Bean  
Wax

*Phaseolus vulgaris*



Goldrush is an early-maturing (54 days) yellow wax bush bean known for its clusters of slender, 5½”– 6” lemon-yellow pods with green tips. The plants are compact, reaching about 1.5 feet in height, and are resistant to Bean Common Mosaic Virus (BCMV), NY15, and Curly Top Virus. Goldrush beans are appreciated for their tender texture, rich flavor, and suitability for pickling or lacto-fermenting.
